In all cases the international department studies the case and usually if it is a new agreement has to be signed with a new Center the decision has to be approved by the Directive Team.

To date we have been moving only in the EU geographical area for the mobilities but we are studying new projects with other regions out of the EU since we know how beneficial this would be for our students and staff.

The most important objectives on our mobility activities for the students is to provide them the Higher level on Education as possible and to make them competitive for their future as musicians. We try to offer them a realistic vision on how the international field is for their professional future.

Our teachers and staff can find in Erasmus programs a way to keep their contacts or to start new ones in order to develop their professional life, knowing that this will impact directly in the students and in our Institution.
